To: Schools in St. Mary's County Re: COVID-19 Prevention & Mitigation for Schools

Dear School Principal and Leadership Team:

Ongoing surveillance of <u>local COVID-19 data</u>¹ by the St. Mary's County Health Department (SMCHD) has shown a continuing surge of the COVID-19 pandemic, likely driven by the new Delta variant of the virus. This state of high community transmission of COVID-19 is mostly affecting those who are not yet vaccinated, although some breakthrough infections of COVID-19 are happening in persons who have been vaccinated. The case rate in the 0-19 age group is higher than it has been at any point in the pandemic.

In accordance with the Local Public Health Advisory² issued by SMCHD, community members (vaccinated and unvaccinated) are strongly urged to wear masks in indoor settings and to get fully vaccinated if they are age eligible. COVID-19 vaccines are very effective in protecting against severe disease and death from variants of the COVID-19 virus that are currently circulating, including the Delta variant. SMCHD recommends a layered approach to reducing the spread of COVID-19 in schools - including COVID-19 vaccination, wearing face masks indoors, improvements to building ventilation, air filtration, physical distancing, and hand hygiene.

Local School Guidance

Local schools can do their part to reduce the spread of COVID-19 in our community by following these public health recommendations:

Masking:

- Require students, employees, and visitors age 2 and older to wear a mask indoors (and outdoors when in groups where six feet distance is difficult to maintain) example Signage: <u>Masks Required</u>
- Encourage and make available more effective mask options such as medical grade, ASTM-rated three-ply surgical masks and K-N95 masks

COVID-19 Vaccine:

- Offer vaccine incentive programs to encourage employees and students to get a <u>COVID-19 vaccine</u> - previously vaccinated workers in school settings may now also be eligible for a <u>COVID vaccine booster dose</u>
- Implement policies requiring employee and student (age 12 and older) vaccination
 - Student vaccination as a prerequisite for participation in high risk sports and high risk extracurricular activities (e.g., football, wrestling, chorus)

School Environment:

- Make <u>improvements to building ventilation</u>³ and air filtration
 - Keep windows open in classrooms, on school buses, cafeterias, auditoriums, school libraries, and other locations when possible
 - Use HEPA air purifier units or HEPA air filtration systems, especially in settings like classrooms and cafeterias
- Make handwashing or hand sanitizer readily available
- Move school activities outdoors as feasible
- Cohort students as best as possible and maintain six foot distancing in cafeteria settings (please note: the 3-6 foot CDC exception for close contact definition in school classrooms does not apply to cafeterias, school buses, and other non-classroom settings)
- Limit non-essential visitors
- During times of substantial or high transmission: Limit sports and extracurricular activities to those that can be held outdoors, with more than 6 feet of physical distancing. Consider canceling high-risk sports and high-risk activities.

COVID-19 Testing:

- Implement a weekly COVID testing program for screening purposes some schools have considered weekly testing of all unvaccinated students/staff, or have randomly selected a certain percentage of unvaccinated staff/students for this each week
- Screening testing for participation in high risk sports and high risk extracurricular activities twice per week
- The Maryland Department of Health (MDH) and Maryland State Department of Education have grant support to offer screening and diagnostic testing services in K-12 schools. Schools that are interested in onsite testing operations should contact the MDH COVID-19 Testing Task Force at <u>MDH.K12Testing@maryland.gov</u>
